### **Frequently Asked Questions:**

What are relics and what do the different classes of relics mean?

There are three classes of relics. First class relics are part of a saint's body. A recent example of a first class relic is the blood of St. John Paul. Another example might be a bone or some hair. First class relics are placed in an altar when it is consecrated. A second class relic would be an item used by the saint, like a piece of clothing. A third class relic is something that has been touched to a first class relic, often a piece of cloth.

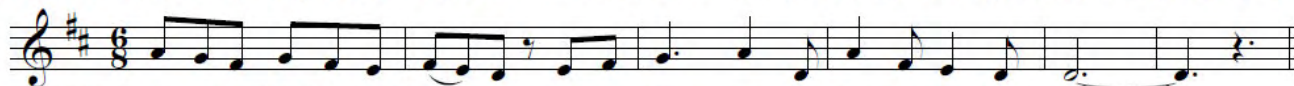

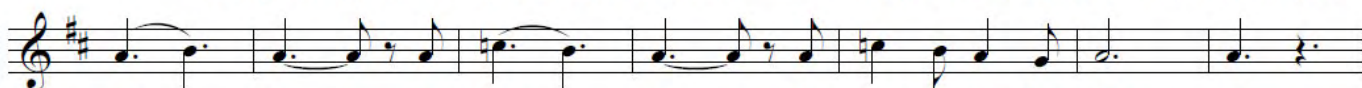
Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father,

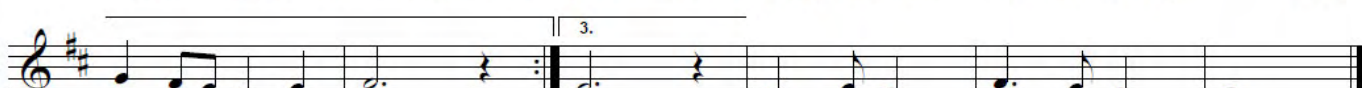
